## **Dayton Warning Issued**

The Hamvention committee just issued the following information for everyone in the Flea Market:

Please try to keep the areas of your Flea Market spaces clear of any trash, debris or other packages or items that may seem out of place. We ask that any trash and packing materials be properly disposed of in any of the many trash barrels/containers placed around the Flea Market. Realizing that you have a wide variety of treasures to display for customers, any unwanted material or packages that aren't your responsibility, should be cleared from the area. If there is any question regarding what a package might contain or concerns about removing something, please contact any of the Hamvention® staff and we will make the appropriate removal.

Although the State of Ohio has laws allowing a Permit to Carry Concealed Weapons, relating to firearms, the Dayton Hara Complex is a "No Carry" zone, which is posted at any of the building's entrances. This "No Carry" regulation extends to any and all of the Hara Complex, which includes the Flea Market and any of the on-site parking areas. Please observe this regulation, as it will be strictly enforced by the Trotwood Police Department.

## **Illinois Repeater Association**

The annual meeting of the Illinois Repeater Association was Saturday, April 20, in Bloomington, IL. This is the organization that coordinates and approves repeater frequencies for the state of Illinois.
